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Welcome to Furthering Talent

Furthering Talent is run by Awards for Young Musicians and Severn Arts.

Awards for Young Musicians is a national charity who support talented young musicians from all across the UK. Severn Arts oversees music education and musical opportunities for young people in your area.

What can I expect for my pupil?

Furthering Talent is designed to support young musicians work towards achieving their musical goals. We will support them in a number of ways:

- Each week during the school year they'll have a 20 minute instrumental lesson funded by Furthering Talent.
- The pupil and their instrumental teacher will work on an Online-Individual Learning Plan (ILP) for the pupil, via Charanga. This is to help set and review musical goals.
- Each pupil can access a £50 Furthering Talent Music Fund via their teacher. The fund renews every April. This can be used towards things that help them achieve the musical goals set in their ILP. For example, it could be used to buy tickets to see live music, to buy sheet music, equipment or many other things. Their teacher will help them decide how to spend their Music Fund.
- Each pupil can meet up with our Furthering Talent Mentor, Victoria Goddard who is available for extra support and advice.

Creating a musical community

Each term we will invite each pupil to a Furthering Talent Get Together event. These are often hands-on music making opportunities. Each one will be different and they can expect to experience many genres of music, from beatboxing to opera or folk music. We hope that pupils and their family will come along and feel part of the Furthering Talent community in Worcestershire.

Financial eligibility

The Furthering Talent Programme is aimed at supporting young musicians from low-income families. We accept nominations based on trust and won't ever ask for evidence. Indicators such as receiving free school meals will be seen as evidence of financial need. We also use the gross family income set by the DfE Music and Dance Scheme as another indicator of financial need. For the 2023/24 academic year we are only able to consider young musicians whose total gross family income is £32,728 or less (once £2,264 has been deducted for each dependent in the family, including the young person being funded). Again, we will not ask for evidence of financial need, but this needs to be a conversation with the parent/carer of the pupil to establish the financial need and therefore the eligibility to the programme.
